ELIGIBILITY

All Work Routes participants must be aged 16 or over and have been unemployed for more than six months.

They must be legally resident and have the right to take paid employment in the UK.

Our support is especially suitable for:

- Lone parents
- Ex-offenders
- People with health conditions
- Older people aged 50+

- People with caring responsibilities
- BAME groups or those with language barriers
- · People with drug or alcohol issues

OUR SUPPORT



1. Referral

2. Initial Appointment

One-to-one adviser support starts with assessments, where necessary.

We help participants complete a bette work on their finances. A detailed action plan is created based on the participant's needs and they are booked into relevant training and future adviser appointments.



3. Personalised Support

We provide personalised support. Our service is tailored to each local area Work Routes is available in and to each individual. Financial support is available for help with travel, interview and work clothing. Our service can also include guidance, training, skills support, help with interview skills, CV writing and application forms, access to work experience, trials and volunteering.

4. Starting and sustaining work

All participants receive 26 weeks in-work support, including weekly contact for the first four weeks of employment, regular support with career development and progression reviews.

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
Royal British Legion Industries (RBLI) is a national charity established in 1919.
